



WHEREAS, the bylaws of the DeBordieu Colony specify in Article VI, section 2 reads as follows:

The use of Common Property owned or controlled by the Association, including but not limited to streets, walkways, waterways and canals, shall be subject to reasonable rules and regulations as may be set forth by the Board of Directors of the Association and the Association shall have the right to suspend membership privileges and to assess fines against the Member, whom himself or whose guest or family members, violate said rules and regulations as established.

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 1 of the bylaws reads as follows:

Its Board of Directors shall manage the affairs of the Association. The Board of Directors shall have full authority to take any and all actions with respect to the affairs of the Association except for such actions as may be specifically reserved to Members of the Association by these By-laws, the Articles of Incorporation or the laws of the State of South Carolina. The Board shall have the power and authority to take any action it deems necessary to enforce rules and regulations governing the conduct of Members and visitors in DeBordieu Colony.

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the Board has the authority to amend the DeBordieu Boat Policy, which was approved and effective beginning July 01, 2001. The amended policy includes a property owner's right to register a boat to include not only boats directly owned by the property owner, but also boats owned by the property owner's immediate family, specifically limited to sons, daughters, son-in-laws, and daughter-in-laws. Up to two boats may be registered by the property owner for a fee of \$25 Additional boats may be registered for a fee of \$35 per boat and must be approved by the General Manager.

In order to register a boat owned by a member of the property owner's immediate family, the property owner must:

- a) Request such registration in writing
- b) Specify the relationship of the boat owner to the property owner
- c) Provide a copy of the State Registration for the boat
- d) Certify that the property owner as well as the boat owner agree the boat(s) will be operated in compliance with the DeBordieu Boating Rules and Regulations

Non-property owners cannot register a boat under any circumstances. Falsification of documentation in support of requested boat registration by a property owner can result in the loss of boating privileges within DeBordieu.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Association Board does hereby approve the amended boat policy as stated above.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the officers of the Association, each of them, shall have authority to fully implement the adoption and enforcement of the Guidelines set forth by the Association.
