



Neighborhood Electric Vehicles (NEVs) are 4-wheeled electric vehicles, whose top speed is not greater than 25 miles per hour and are manufactured with basic safety equipment including: headlamps, stop lamps, turn signal lamps, tail lamps, reflex reflectors, parking brake, windshields of either type AS-1 or type AS-5 glazing, rearview mirrors, seat belts and vehicle identification numbers (VINs). NEVs are bigger and heavier, and have more superstructure than golf cars.

NEVs are subject to the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 500, which requires the safety equipment listed above. They must be titled, registered and insured just like a car or truck!

- **NEVs must be registered with DeBordieu Security.** Registration requirements are the same as for other motor vehicles. You must present your insurance, and vehicle registration.
- As with other motor vehicles, a regular member decal will be issued. Decals for NEVs will count for your one of two free vehicles. Additional decals are \$15 each.
- NEVs are considered low speed vehicles (top speed 25 mph) and all laws and regulations which apply to cars apply to NEVs. **They must be driven on the street, not on the golf cart paths.**
- Only licensed drivers may operate NEVs
- NEVs can only be driven on roads with a posted speed limit of 35mph or under
